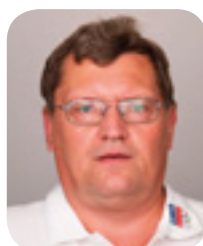

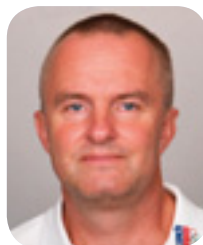

## HEAD COACH

# ALOIS HADAMCZIK

**Born**  
**June 20, 1952**  
**in Kravare, Czech Republic**

### HEAD COACH

Silver WCH 2006. Bronze OG 2006, WCH 2011 and 2012. Bronze WCH U20 2005.

In 1984, he began his career as a coach in Třinec, while pursuing his coaching studies at Charles University in Prague. He worked in Třinec until 1990, then in the early 1990s moved to Germany, where he coached for Soudhofen and Füssen.

After returning home, he worked as a coach in Olomouc (1992-93) and Vítkovice (1993-94) and, subsequently, returned back to Třinec (1995-99). In 1995, he advanced with the local club to the Extraliga, the highest league in the Czech Republic, and in each of the following seasons his team made it to the playoffs. In 1998 and 1999, Třinec won silver and bronze, respectively.

In 2001, he won another bronze medal, this time with Vítkovice, a regional rival of Třinec, and the very next season his club advanced to the Extraliga finals. Later on, he coached HC Sparta Prague, helping the team win bronze medals in the 2002/03 and 2003/04 seasons. In

2008, he returned to Vítkovice, and in the 2009/10 season, his team made it to the finals again.

At the international level, he started as coach of the Czech under-20 team, with which he won the bronze medal at the 2005 World Championship in the United States. This team included players such as David Krejčí, Rostislav Olesz and Roman Červenka.

The following season, he became head coach of the Czech national team. He was in charge of the team during the 2006-08 period, capturing bronze at the 2006 Olympics in Turin and silver at the 2006 World Championship in Riga.

He returned to the national team's bench in the summer of 2010. The national team, led by Hadamczik and assistant coach Josef Paleček, won the bronze medal at the 2011 World Championship in Slovakia and at the 2012 World Championship in Sweden and Finland.

Josef Paleček started his ice hockey career in Kolín, but moved to Pardubice at the age of 18 and played 12 seasons for the local club, winning a Czech title in 1973. During his military service, he was also playing for Dukla Jihlava, taking his league total to 451 games, scoring 171 goals.

His scoring skills did not go unnoticed and Paleček was present at three World Championships. In 1972 in Prague, he helped Czechoslovakia win the gold medal alongside Ivan Hlinka, Jiří Holeček and Václav Nedomanský.

Paleček started coaching in the early '80s as a playing coach in Hradec Králové. After a short playing career in Austria and Germany, he switched to coaching on a full-time basis. He moved up through the ranks of youth and junior teams to the helm of the Pardubice senior squad, leading the team for three spells (1990-92, 1995-96 and 1999-2002). In the process, he also became the club's sports director.

Paleček's long career also features a stop in Denmark and a spell with the Czech U19 national team. In the 2003/04 season, he was called up by struggling Liberec. It was too late to save a bad season in 2004, but the club flourished under Paleček's guidance in the following years, finishing first in the Czech Extraleague regular season and winning bronze medals twice in three seasons.

In 2007, Paleček decided to leave the club and became Alois Hadamczik's assistant coach at the helm of Czech national team. However, just a few months later he returned to club coaching, accepting an offer from Karlovy Vary. In his very first season with the club, he helped rewrite local hockey history, winning the Czech Extraleague title in 2009. In the summer 2010, Paleček joined a new coaching staff of the Czech national team.

František Musil began his hockey career in Pardubice, where he started playing in Czechoslovakia's first league at age 16. A physical defenceman, he also became a member of the national U18 and U20 teams, playing in three consecutive World Junior Championships and making the tournament all-star team in 1984.

He tasted international success at the senior level for the first time in the spring of 1983, when at age 18 he played in his first World Championship. He played in 4 games and won a silver medal that year, and then won a gold on home ice in Prague two years later as one of the team's top defencemen.

After two years with Dukla Jihlava, including a domestic title in 1985, Musil moved overseas at age 21 to begin a 14-year NHL career with the Minnesota North Stars, Calgary Flames, Ottawa Senators and Edmonton Oilers. His best season was 1990-91, when he recorded 23 points in 75 games.

In the spring of 1992, he won his third and final medal for Czechoslovakia and his second on home ice – a bronze in Prague.

During the 1994-95 NHL lockout, Musil returned to his home country to play 19 games for Sparta Prague in the Czech Extraleague, and then started the following season in Karlovy Vary before returning to the NHL. After retiring in 1999 and sitting out the 1999-2000 season, he returned to play 13 more games with the Oilers in 2000-01 and then 16 games with hometown Dukla Jihlava the following year, where he finished his playing career in 2002.

After retiring, Musil became a scout for the Edmonton Oilers – a post he held until 2013. He was an assistant coach under for the Czech Republic under Alois Hadamczik at the 2006 World Championship, winning a bronze medal. In 2013-14, he returns to work under Hadamczik for the Czech national team.

His oldest son, David, has played for the Czech Republic at the World Junior Championships and is a draft pick of the Edmonton Oilers. His younger son, Adam, currently plays for the Red Deer Rebels of the WHL.



## GENERAL MANAGER **SLAVOMÍR LENER**

**Born**  
**March 10, 1955**  
**in Beroun, Czech Republic**

### COACH AND ASSISTANT COACH

Gold OG 1998. Gold WCH 1996. Bronze WCH 1997 and 1998.

Slavomír Lener started playing hockey in Dobruška. Hockey was not his only interest, as he was into football and tennis, as well. After finishing high school, he moved to study for a coaching degree at Charles University in Prague under the guidance of the respected coach Vladimír Kostka.

During his military service in Jihlava, he helped with coaching of the local senior and junior teams. He had spells at Jihlava B (1980-81) and CLTK Prague (1981-86) before being employed by Czech Ice Hockey Association.

He spent some time on an internship in China, but moved to Canada in 1990. Lener was working at Hockey Canada before joining NHL's Calgary Flames as an assistant coach. He spent seven years in the NHL, working for Flames (1992-95) and Florida Panthers (1998-2002).

Lener became involved with Czech national teams, leading juniors to semi-

finals at 1996 World Junior Championship in Boston. In 1996, Lener together with Luděk Bukač guided Czech senior team to gold medals at World Championship in Austria, followed by two bronze medals in 1997 and 1998. He was together with Ivan Hlinka coach of the famous team at 1998 Olympics in Nagano, Japan, leading Czech Republic to the arguably biggest victory of their hockey history. Lener later enjoyed some time as a head coach of the national team, working at 2003 and 2004 championships in Helsinki and Prague, respectively.

In the meantime, his club career in Europe involved Sparta Prague (1996-98 and 2004-05), Düsseldorf in Germany (2007) and a couple of clubs in Sweden – Luleå (2005-07) and Linköping (2008-10).

In 2010, he became a Head of Coaching at Czech Ice Hockey Association.
